ALICE DOESN'T LIVE HERE ANYMORE

USA, 1974, 112 minutes, Director: Martin Scorsese In the wake of Mommy, screened last month by Ciné-Club Saturna, we are pleased to present another movie featuring the dynamics between mother and son. Directed in 1974 by a young Martin Scorsese, one the most influential of all current Hollywood filmmakers, Alice Doesn't Live Here Anymore is warm-hearted and light-toned, blending comedic touches with incisive characterizations and an expressive style. A young widow and her son take to the road in the southwestern United States in search of a new life. The narrative freely invokes the road movie genre and contains a number of classic moments—the depiction of life in a typical roadside diner is stellar. Along with the most important American movies of the 1970s, including Nashville, Alice Doesn't Live Here Anymore instills a new realism in film and emphasizes the great American vernacular—the common culture. Ellen Burstyn won the Oscar for Best Actress in 1974 for her portrayal of Alice.
